- No make-up tests or exams will be arranged. If a student is absent due to special circumstances, they must apply in advance and submit relevant supporting documents. Approval must be granted by the school before any special arrangements are made.
- If a student is absent due to illness, a medical certificate for the day of absence must be submitted. Otherwise, the missed paper will be marked as zero.

5. Handling of Test and Examination Results for Absentees

Starting this academic year, if a student is absent from a test or examination and the application for absence is approved by the school, the score for the missed paper will be calculated using a **score estimation method**. This means the student's previous scores for the same paper will be used to estimate the result, and **80% of the estimated score** will be counted as the final mark.

All applications and decisions will be reviewed and finalised by the Assessment Committee. We kindly ask parents to take note of this arrangement.
